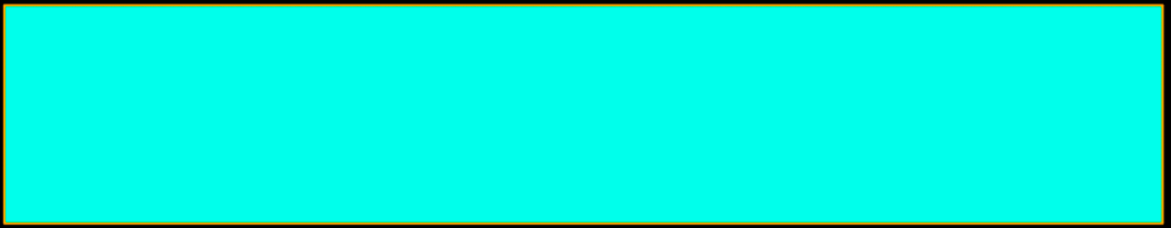


The twins floated in the basket for hours. They bumped up and down over the rushing water until they finally washed up on the muddy shore. Later that day, they were found by a wolf ...



How would you describe the wolf and use suspense to describe the situation?



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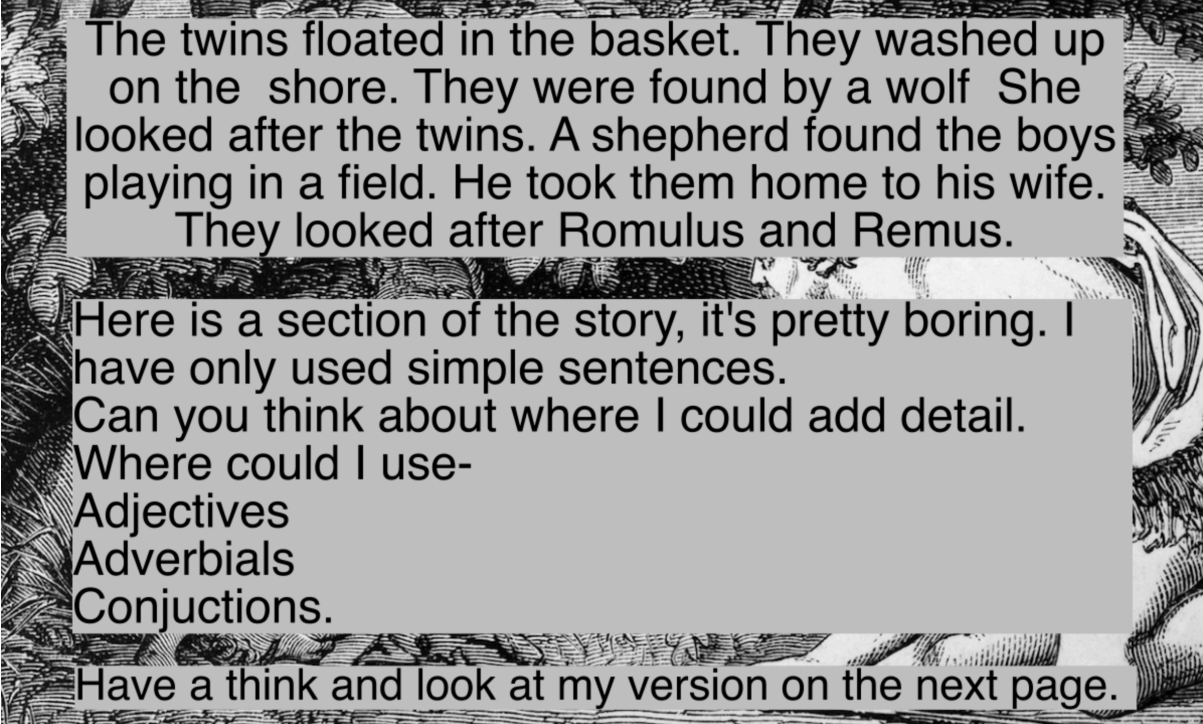

Can you think about where I could add detail.

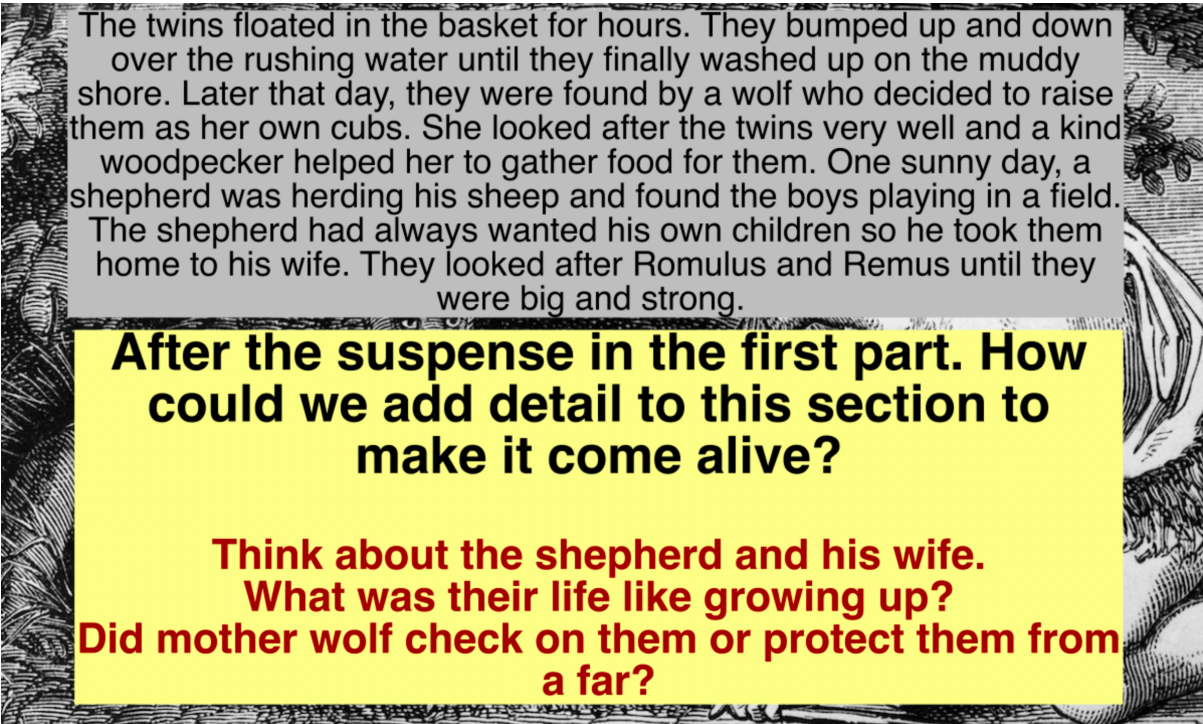
