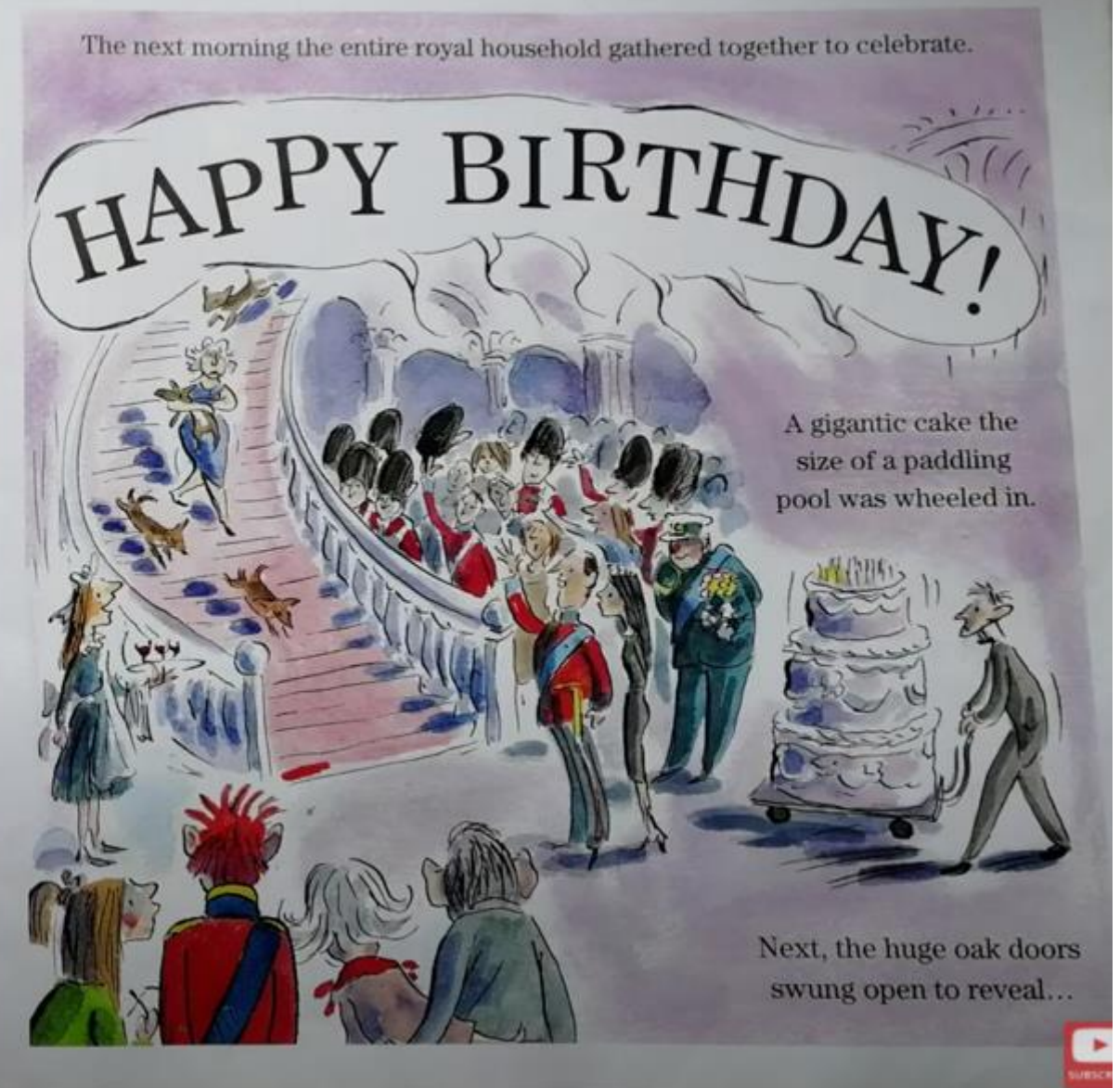
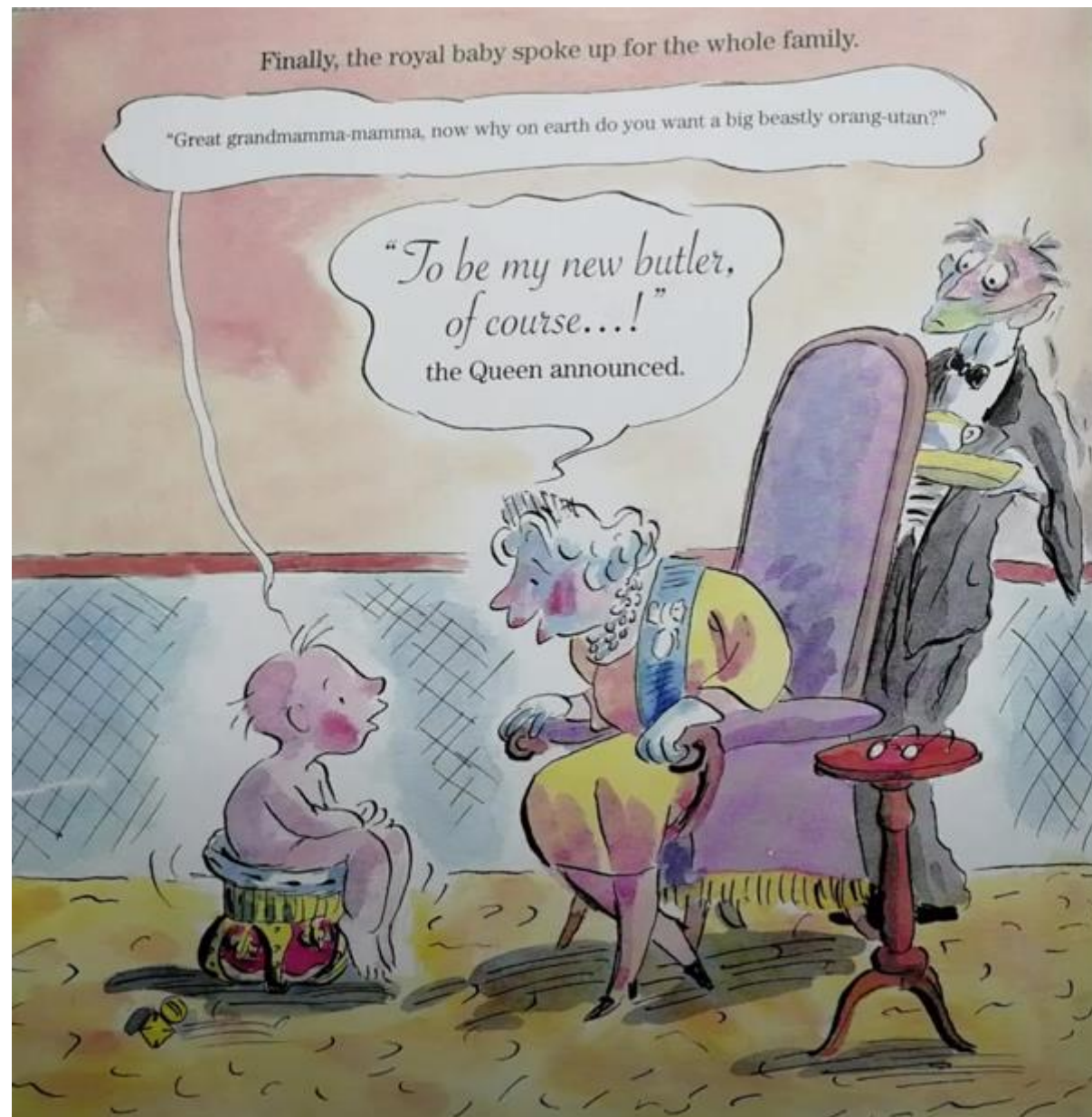

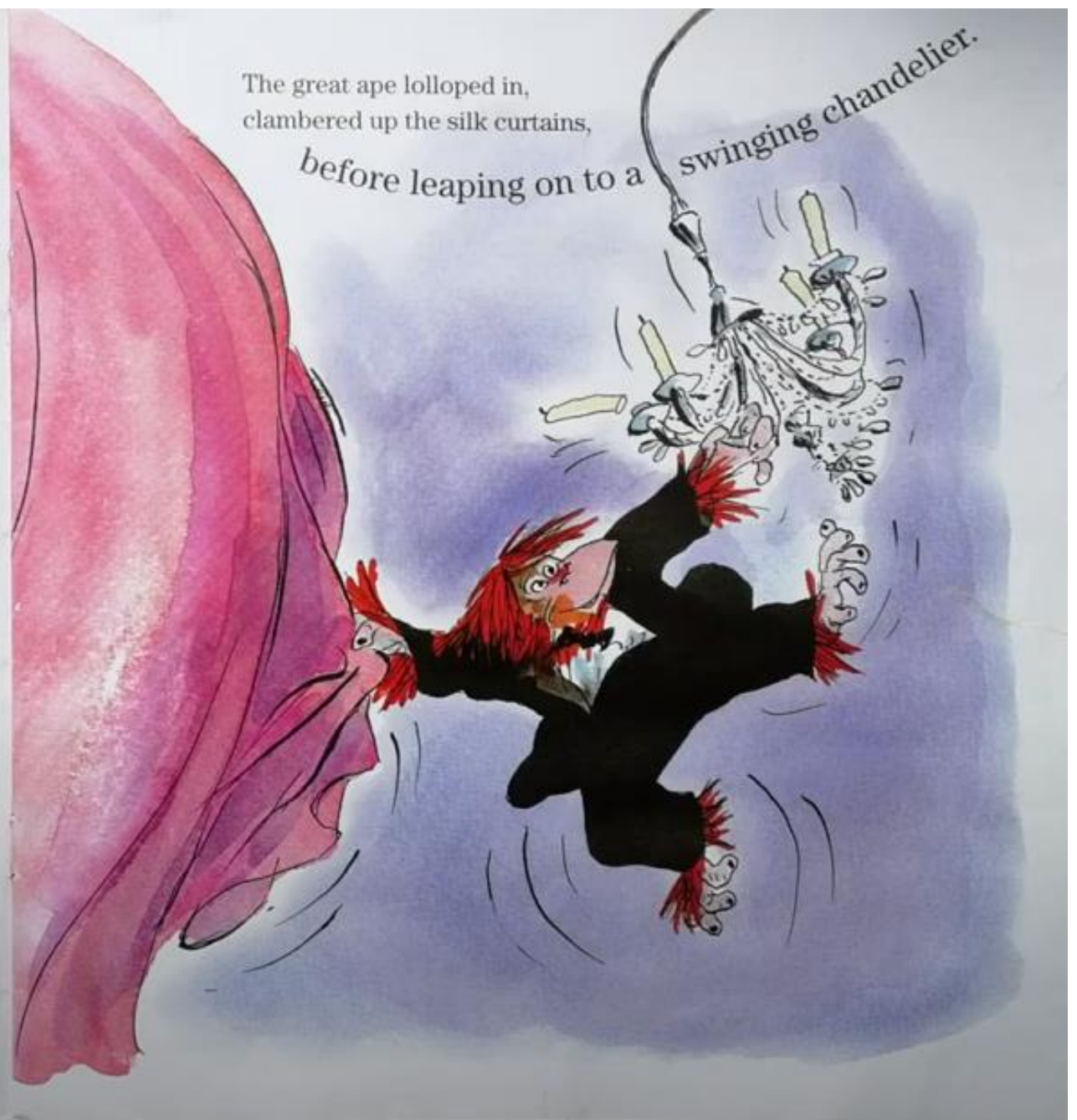
You will have some sections of the text to read yourself and then answer the questions. Try to find the key word or phrase in the questions which you can look for in the text to find the answer.

2. What did the Royal Baby guess the Queen might want for her birthday?

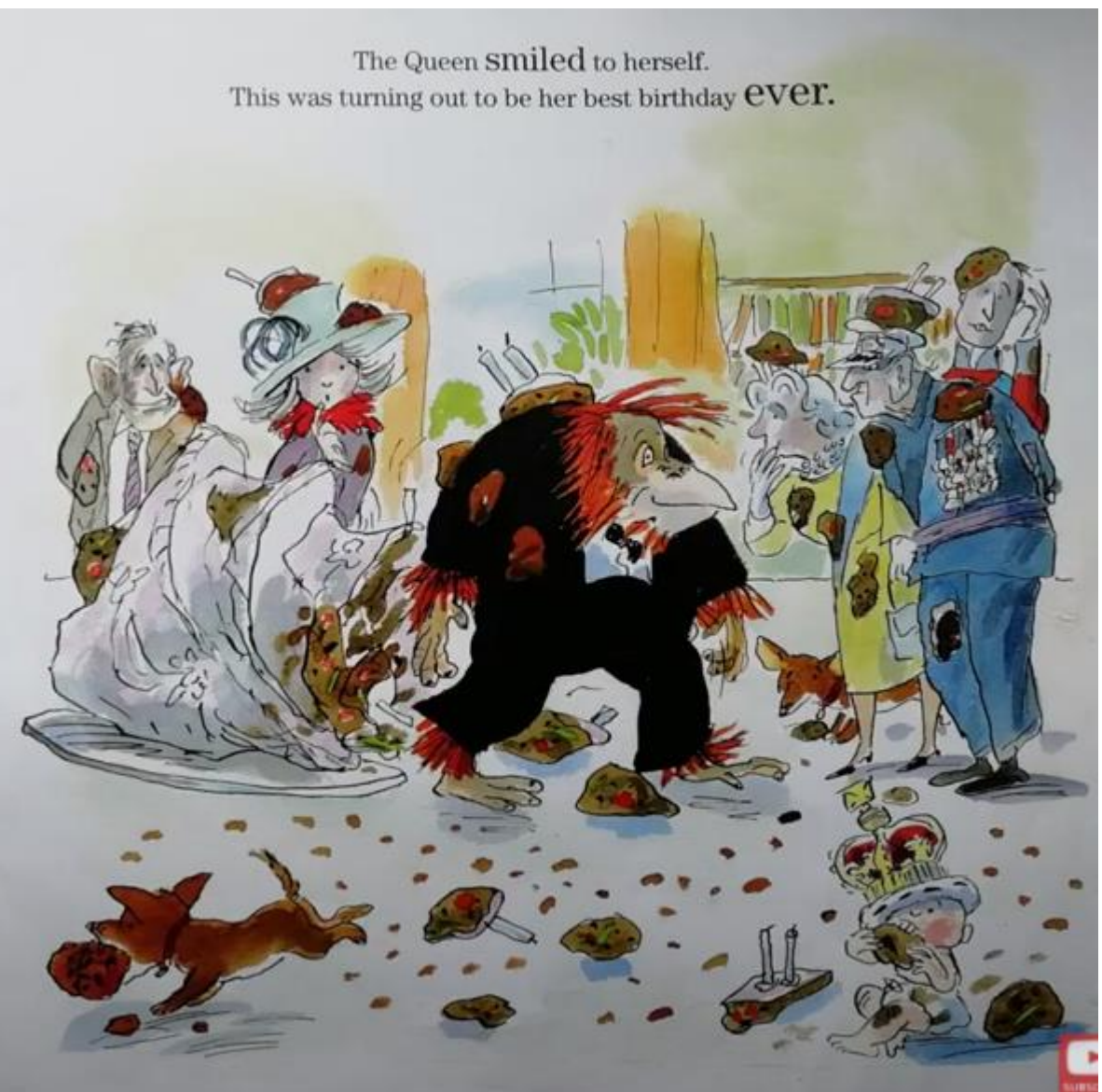
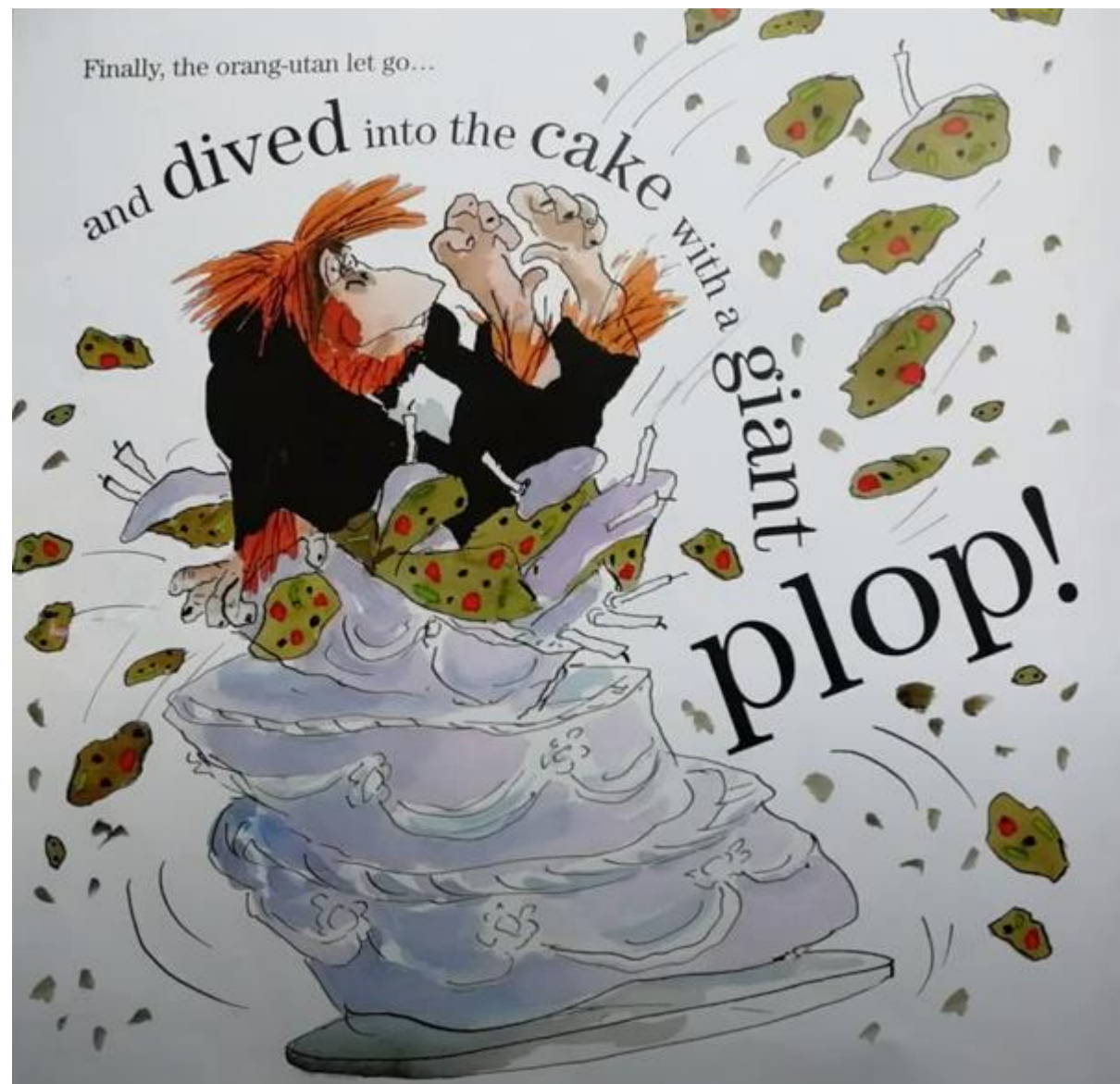


3. Why does the Queen want an orang-utan?
