These are two extracts, both from information texts; the first is about air travel and the second about the city of Birmingham.

Planes are used across the world for both domestic travel (when people travel within their own country) and international travel (when people travel to a different country). There are numerous different reasons why someone may choose to fly somewhere, but generally speaking, air travel is split into business use and leisure use (which includes holidays).

Birmingham is England's second-largest city; it is found in the centre of the country, and is well-connected to the capital city, London, as well as other important cities, such as Manchester. Its name can be traced back to $Beormingah\bar{a}m$; this literally means 'the home or settlement of the Boermingas', and that was the name of the tribe who originally started living in the area.
