

"THAT'S IT!" he exclaimed. The sea was just like a gigantic bath – he would simply unplug it!



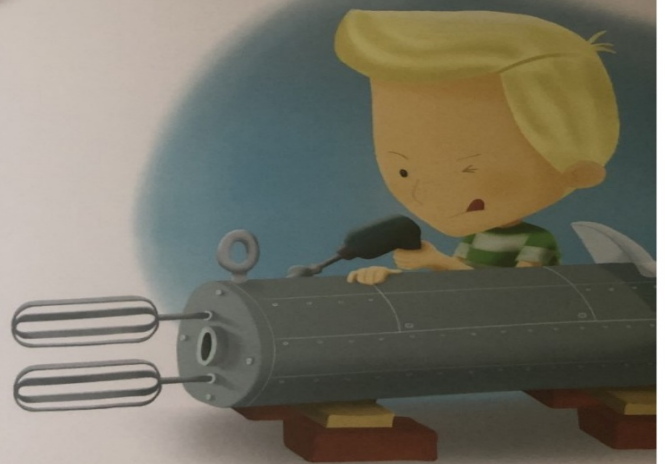
Without delay, Marcel got

late into the night...

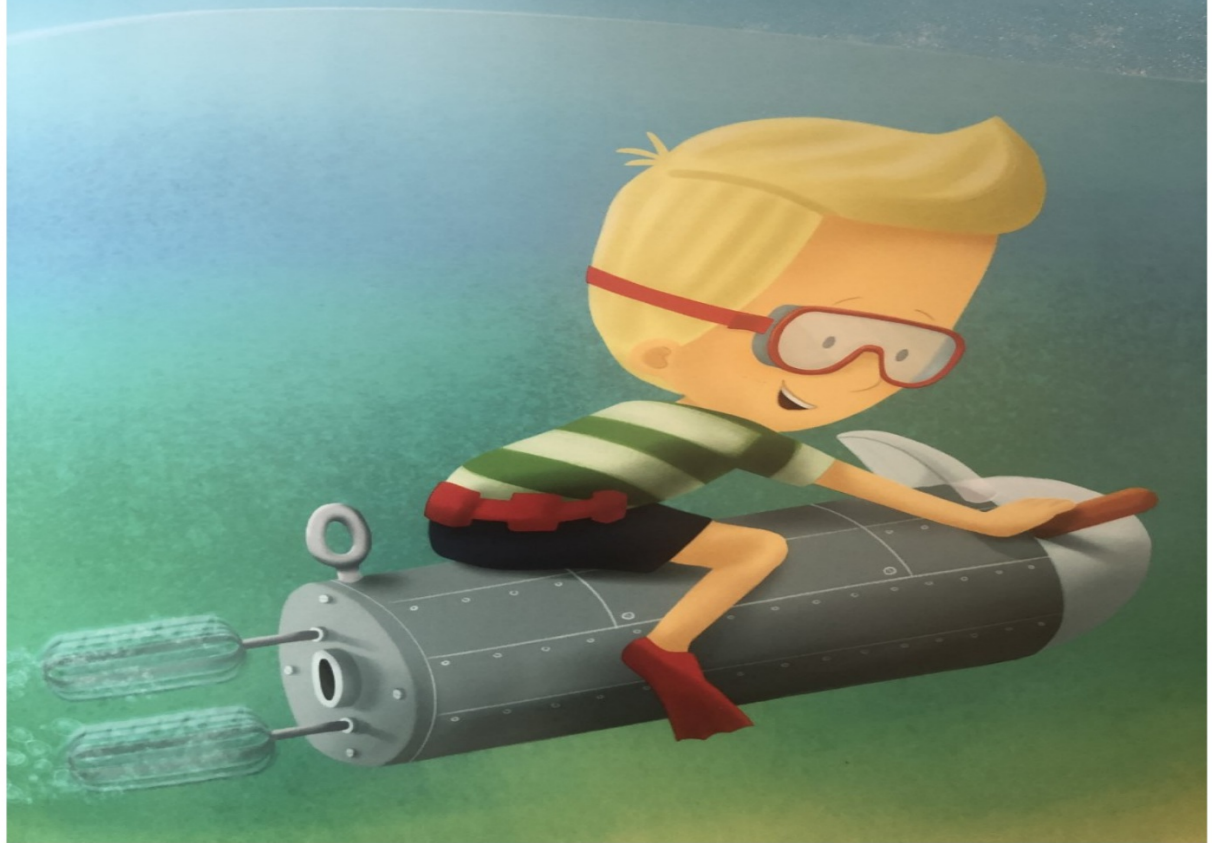
...until finally, with the last

of his propeller, he disappeared below the surface.

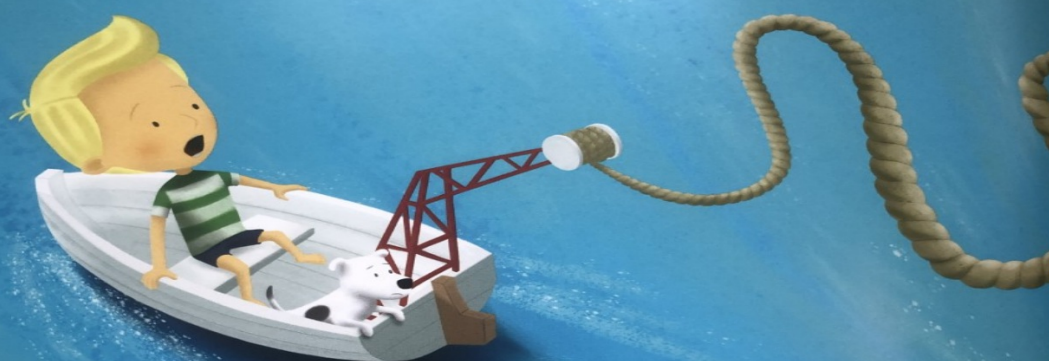




Marcel travelled deeper and deeper underwater,
