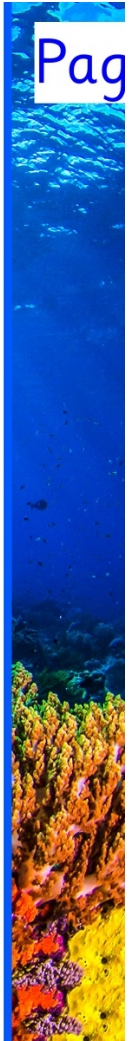
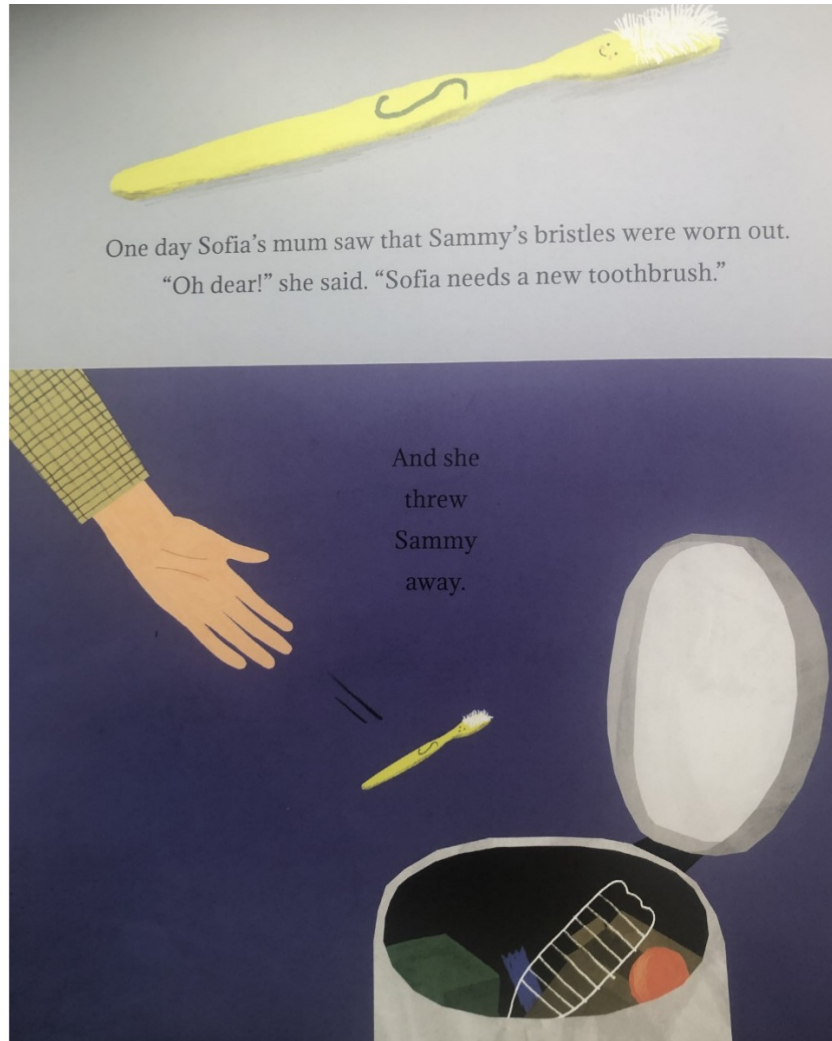


Six-year-old Sofia was allowed to choose her own toothbrush. She picked one as yellow as sunshine and drew an S on its tummy.

“His name is Sammy.”



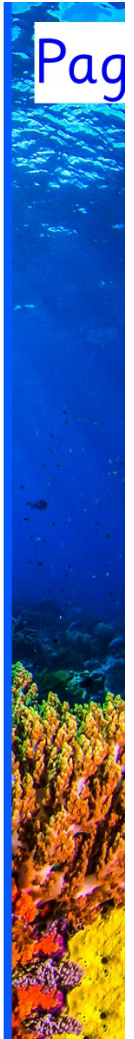


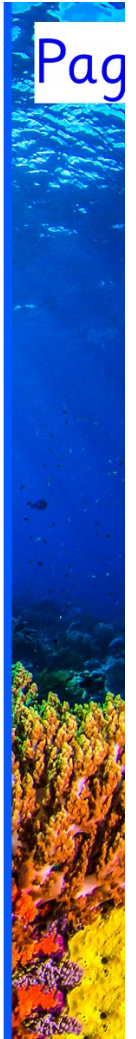
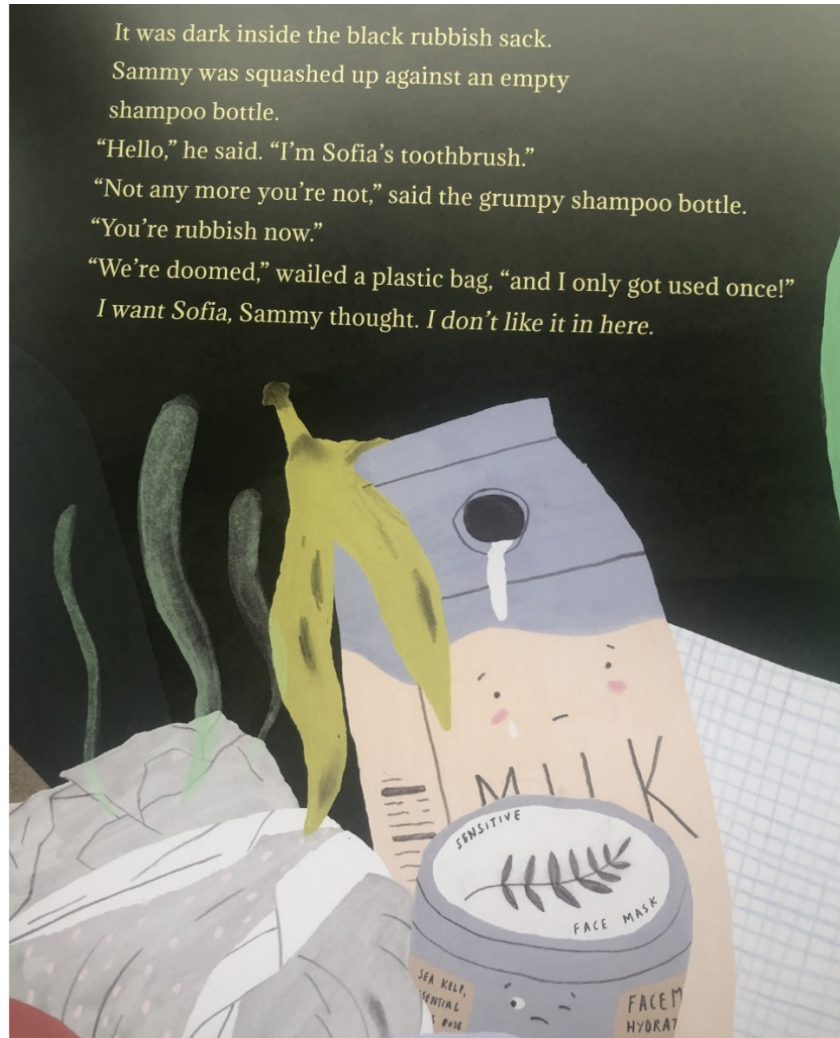




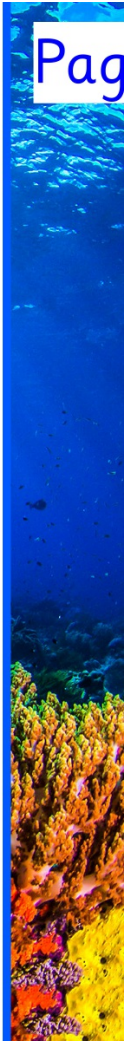
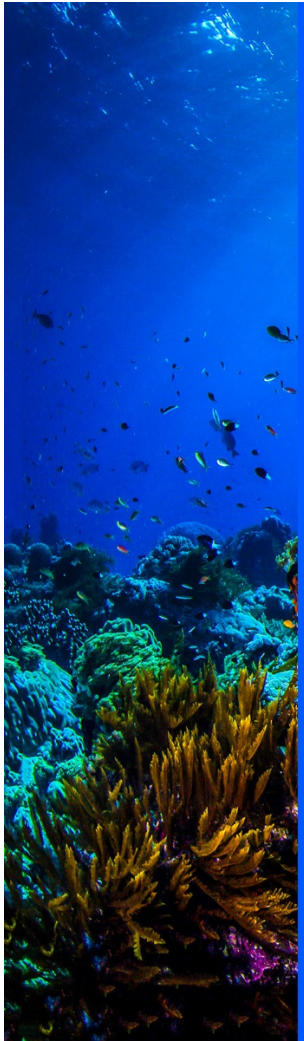
“That’s not Sammy,” cried Sofia, when she saw a red toothbrush beside the sink. “Where is he?”

But the dustmen had emptied the bins and taken Sammy away.













The blast of a ship's horn startled Sammy.

"You mean, I'm a sailor?" Sammy smiled. "Wait till I tell Sofia."

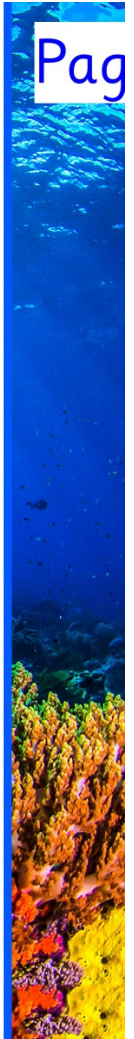


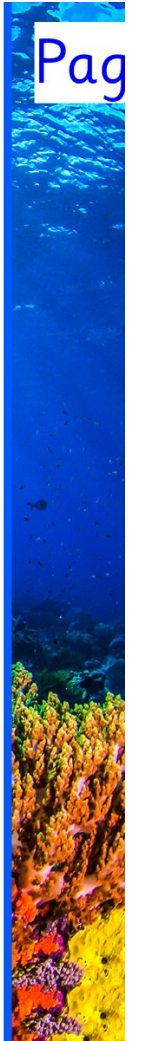
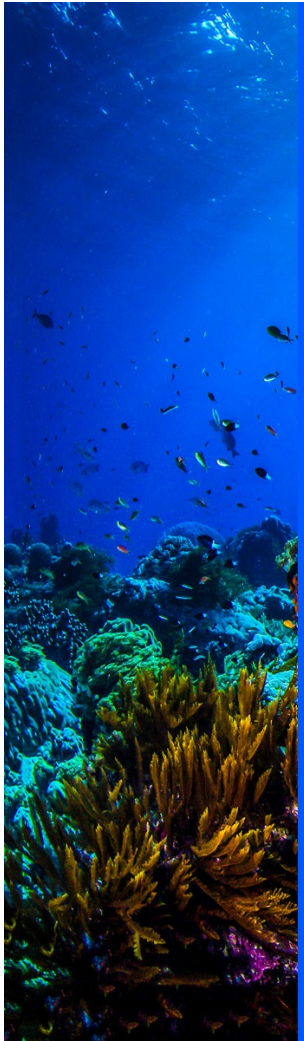
Sammy sailed across the sea for countless days and nights.

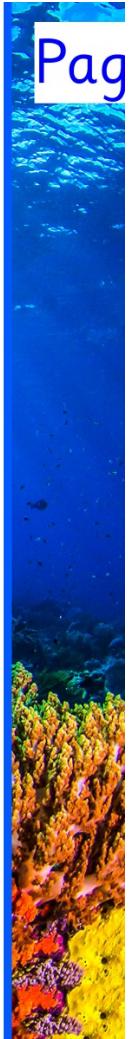
This new, hot place was a long way from Sofia.

“Help me, please,” Sammy said. “I sailed here on a boat, but I want to go back home.”

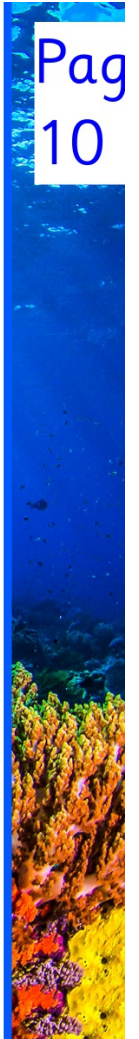


“Hold tight.” The rat took Sammy between his teeth and dragged him to the river. “This river leads to the sea. Go back the way you came. Good luck.”



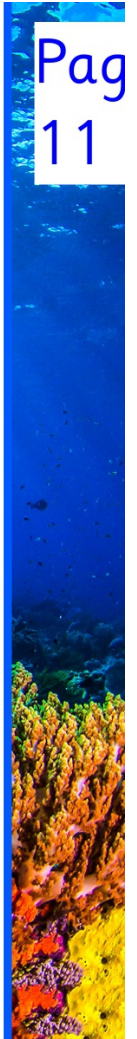
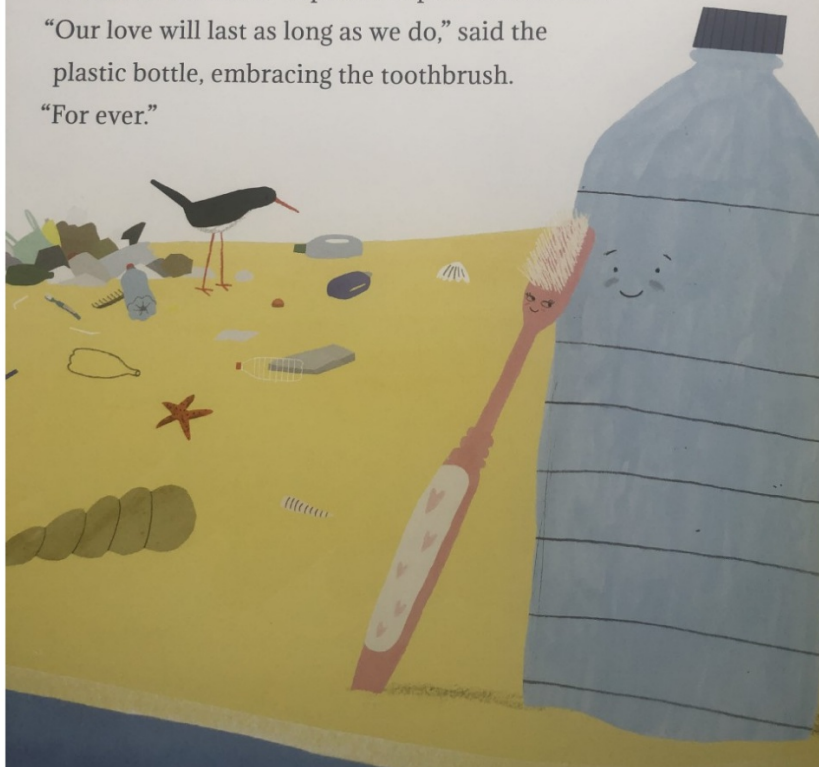


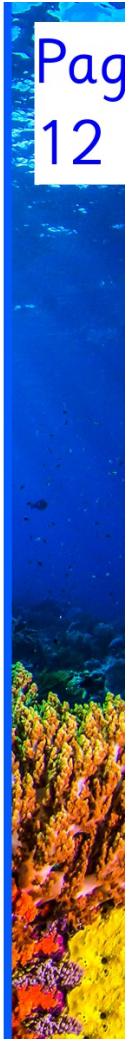
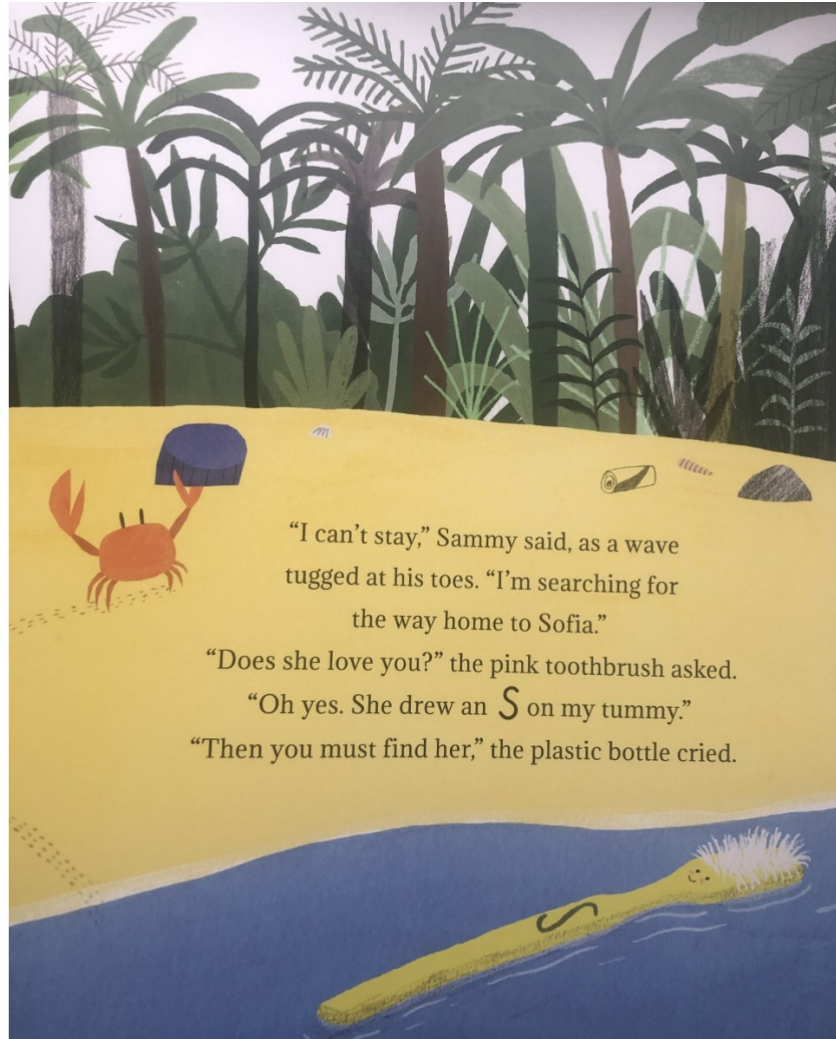
“Thank you, friend rat,”

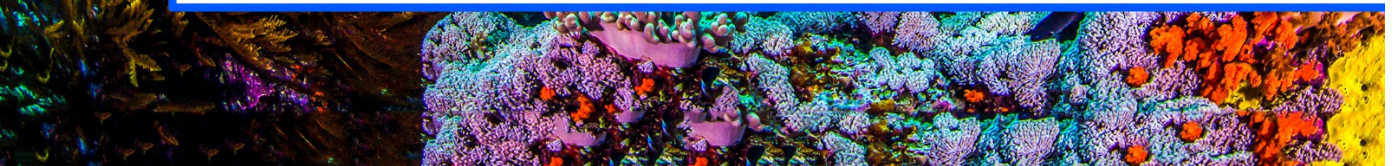

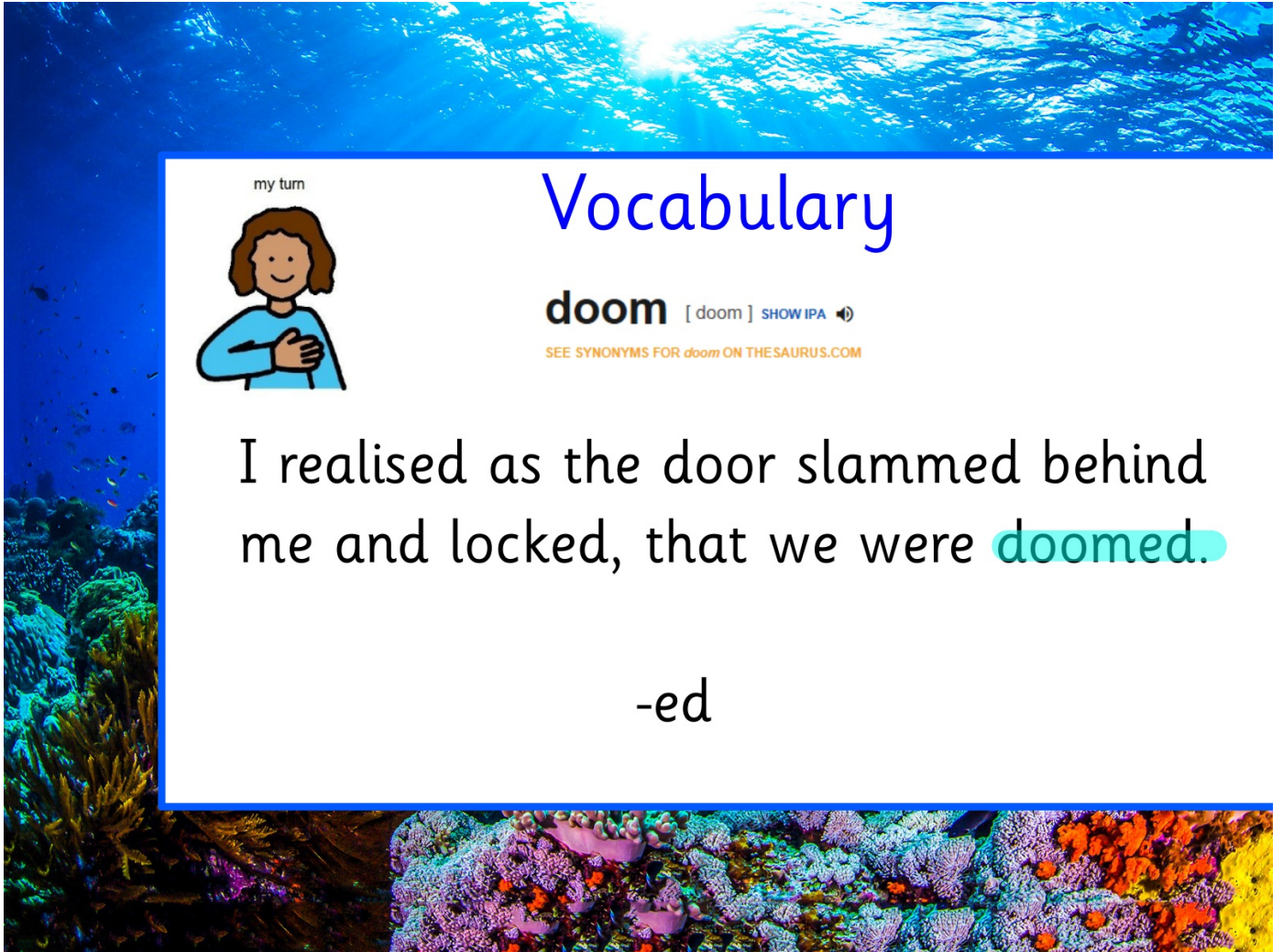
