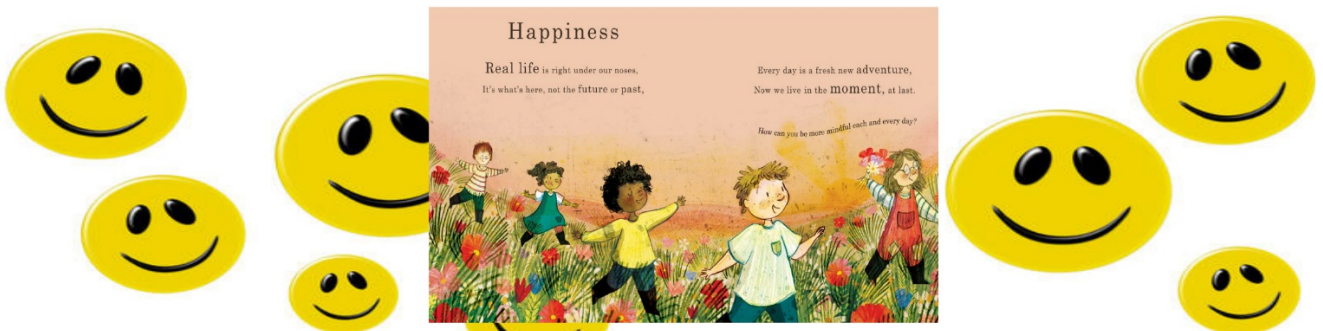
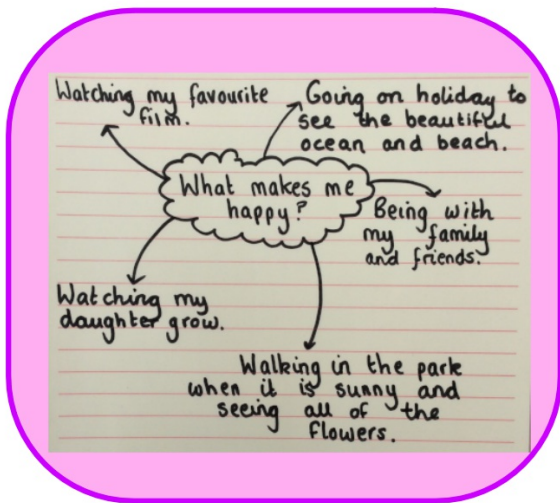


Today we are going to create a happiness poem.

Each idea will start on a new line.



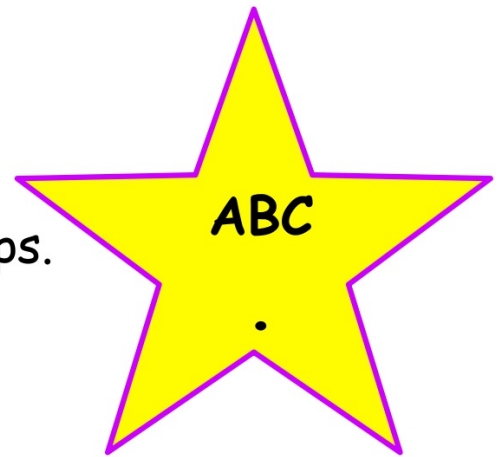
Each line will start with 'Happiness is...'



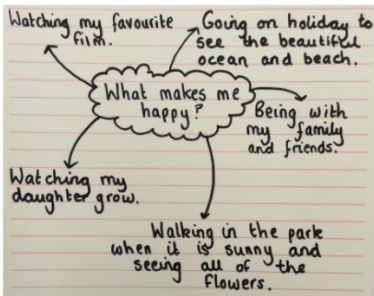
Will include noun phrases to make it more detailed.

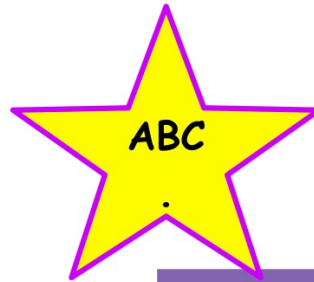

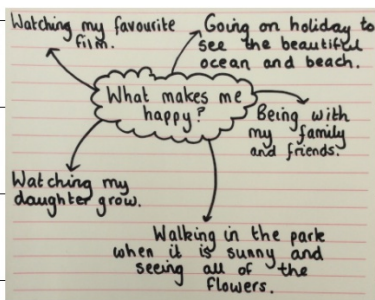
