


Today you are going to build a setting description for one of the photographs you looked at yesterday.



Remind yourself, what could you see in this photographs that the boy discovered on the camera film?


We are going to use adjectives and our imagination to creat a setting description for one of the images.

- How we can describe the other things in the image.




What sort of day is it?
