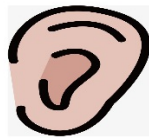


Balance Targets

"It's horrible and smelly."

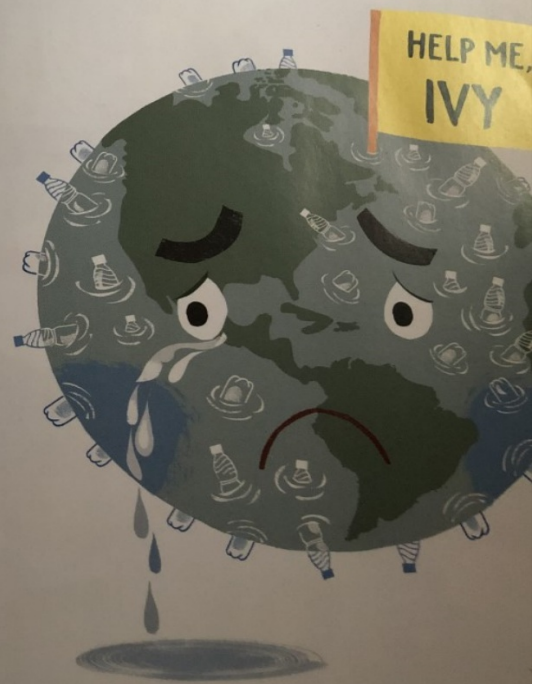


So why's it floating everywhere?

It took hold like a craze.



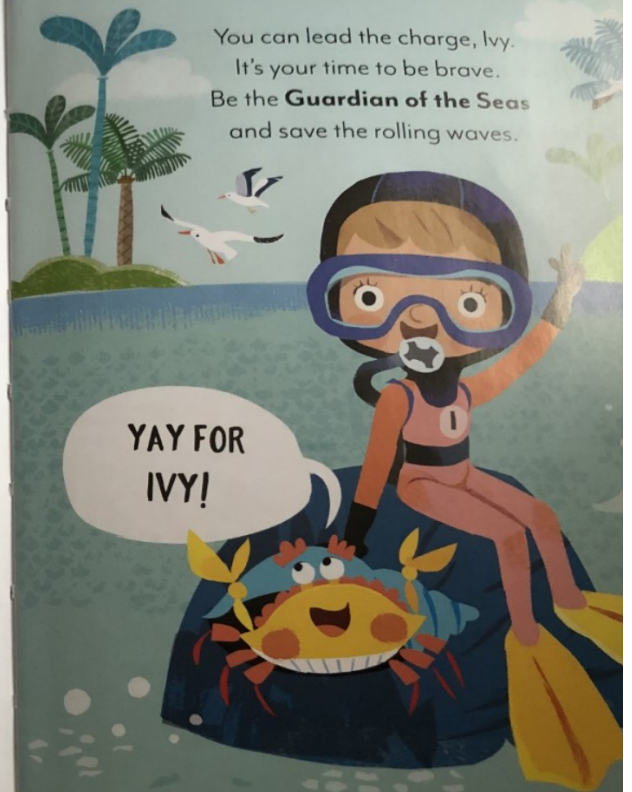
But now we know that plastic

by fishermen.

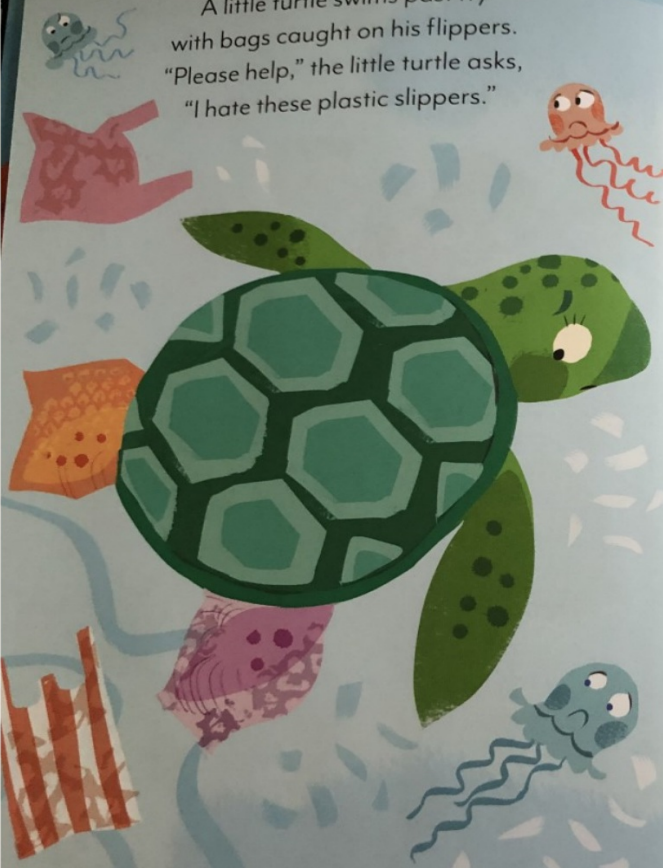
An octopus cries, "Ivy, help!

the ocean is **our home!**"

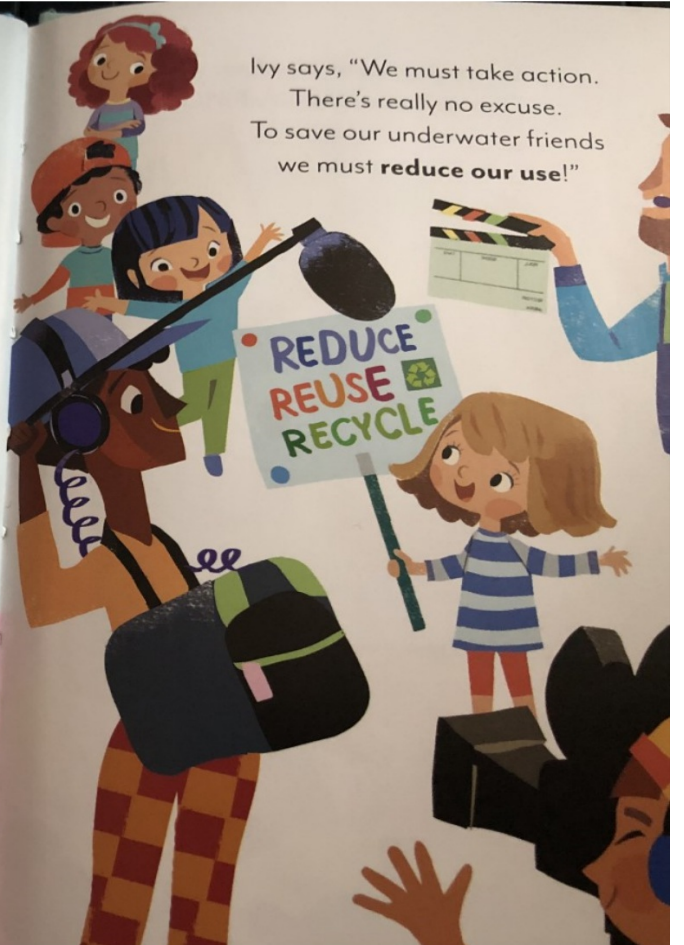
