Today we are going to look at the original text a little more before we write, and from two perspectives:

- 1. The reader's (the child or class who is our main audience)
- 2. The author's

We are going to think about:

- how the reader would react to each part (and how this links into the purposes we have of wanting to entertain them, but also help reinforce important values and make them feel safe and confident about life)
- Why the author wants to include certain elements (which will link to the purpose, but which may have other motivations too).



Two perspectives:

1. Reader's 2. Author's

The reader's perspective might be: Ooh, this sounds like a story I am going to enjoy as it's packed with things that are good in a story.

The author's perspective might be: This is a way to start a story — often stories launch straight in, but in this story, there is a clear relationship between the narrator and the reader, and this line helps show this. It's also a way to introduce those values right now before they get into the main body of the story This week, we are going to write our story based on our story "The Wondrous Road Ahead".

In our story, we (the narrator) speak directly to the reader, in the present and future tense.

We want to intrigue and excite them first!
