

One of the objectives we are working on in our story-writing is the cohesive devices.

They help the reader to understand the story such as:

- what happens when
- where different things are
- who said what to whom

and doing so without boring them!

Let's recap the cohesive devices...

COHESION

The 2014 primary curriculum states that children in Years 5 and 6 need to 'use a wide range of devices to build cohesion within and across paragraphs'.

Basically, when a person's writing has cohesion, an attempt has been made to link clauses, sentences and paragraphs so that the writing 'hangs together'.

- pronouns
- adverbials and conjunctions
- synonyms
- punctuation
- determiners
