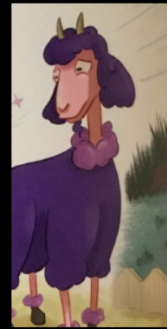


# Story Structure

# *The Wondrous Road Ahead* setting



*The Wondrous Road Ahead* is an illustrated book.

That means our words will need to do the things the illustrations in the original book do.

# **STORY ELEMENTS**

Today, we are going to plan ideas for our three characters and their settings.

When you begin to write, you need to consider:

1. Which value comes first in your story
2. The basic ideas about the character
3. Choosing a character name
4. Choosing a setting

1. Value: bravery

2. Character basic: I need a character who is not brave, who, is the opposite-overly cautious, wary and cowardly. I used the images of Pokemon and other images as inspiration. I noticed a bird-like character and loved the idea of that being my cowardly character, as I figured she might be too cowardly to fly!





3. Character name: The names in the original are alliterative, so I'll go with this too. The name isn't super important so don't spend too long on it - Cowardly Cooderfly works as it's alliterative, multi-syllabic and is nonsense, but sounds like it could be a real word.

4. Setting: I imagine her being in somewhere where not being able to fly is an issue. Maybe some mountainous area with a large valley and without being brave enough to fly over the rocky parts, she can't visit its family nor explore very far.

Your task today, is to generate ideas for all three sets of characters and settings. You can go back to the previous slides to look my examples to help you.
