## Question One (1 Mark)

#### 1 mark for a relevant explanation in context

E.g. Anne's diary entries have had an enormous impact worldwide; they have been well received and admired by millions of individuals suggesting the book is very popular.

## Question Two (2 Marks)

## 1 mark for identification of feelings/emotions

E.g. Otto Frank was frustrated and annoyed when he had to hand over his company.

# 2 marks for a more developed response using evidence from the text

E.g. Although Otto Frank was probably annoyed and afraid when he was asked to hand over his company, he did not retaliate to the daily discrimination and continued with his daily life as best as he could.


## Question Three (2 Marks)

## 1 mark for a relevant explanation in context

E.g. It meant that Anne could record her feelings, hopes and dreams.

## 2 marks for a more developed response using evidence from the text

E.g. The diary was significant to Anne because it became her solace from the hardships being endured. She didn't use it to record grief and negativity however, she wanted to record her hopes and dreams. It became like a close friend to her.



## Question Four (2 Marks)

#### 1 mark for a relevant explanation in context

E.g. The Jews were likely to receive a more severe punishment if found hiding.

## 2 marks for a more developed response using evidence from the text

E.g. The Nazi's persecution of the Jews was intensifying and Margot's parents refused to let her go to a concentration camp; this shows braveness because it suggests that they were not afraid of the possible consequences if they were to be found out. They were also brave because they could be discovered at any time.

# Question Five (2 Marks)

## 1 mark for relevant explanation in context

E.g. Because they knew that the Germans were being defeated by the Allies.

## 2 marks for a more detailed response using evidence from the text

E.g. They were hopeful because they had remained undiscovered and safe in their hideout; furthermore, they knew that the Germans were being defeated so this suggests that they would remain safe, survive and be set free to live their lives.


## Question Six (2 Marks)

## 1 mark for own interpretation/understanding

E.g. Response highlights the upset, fear or frustration that Anne and her family might have felt when they were discovered.

## 2 marks for further explanation

E.g. Anne's family would have felt fear and deep upset at being discovered especially because they had been undetected for so long and the war nearly coming to an end. They would have been fearful for their lives.



#### Question Seven (2 Marks)

#### 1 mark for own interpretation/understanding

E.g. Response highlights the compassion, pride, tenderness or sadness that Otto Frank might have felt when he discovered and read the diary following Anne's passing.

#### 1 further mark for development of own ideas

E.g. By making reference to evidence from the text or explaining why Otto Frank might have felt this way.

#### Question Eight (3 Marks)

#### 1 mark for own interpretation/understanding

E.g. Anne's optimism is demonstrated through the quotes included in her diary.

#### 2 marks for a relevant point using evidence from the text

E.g. She makes reference to being free to walk in the sunshine once more and that 'where there's hope there's life.'

#### 3 marks for justification/explanation of 2 ideas and evidence

E.g. Anne remained positive throughout her captivity because she wrote of all 'the beauty that still remains'. She was looking forward to walking in the sunshine and was anticipating a positive outcome.
