BIOGRAPHY OF ANNE FRANK READING COMPREHENSION – STANDARD Qs

Question One (2 Marks)

1 mark for an appropriate response with no evidence

E.g. because it was one of the most vital and valuable lessons/thoughts Anne could give to others.

2 marks for an appropriate response with evidence

E.g. because Anne ironically inspired others without any thought of doing so. For example she says 'you don't know how great you can be' which is true as Anne used to write to get away from her 'hardships.'

Question Two (2 Marks)

1 mark for defining 'enduring'

E.g. it would be an everlasting symbol; it will forever be remembered.

2 marks for a correct definition of enduring with an elaboration of the quote

E.g. it means that despite any negative or hard situation, there is always hope and confidence about the future. Anne stayed positive throughout her time in captivity and her diary is an important symbol of the hope she never lost. It is an inspiration to others.

Question Three (2 Marks)

1 mark for a relevant impression with no elaboration

E.g. Hitler was a vile/unpleasant/unkind/monstrous man.

2 marks for an appropriate impression with evidence from the text

E.g. Hitler was a repulsive man as he strongly hated those who supported the Jewish faith. He made them feel isolated as he ensured 'Jews were not allowed to have jobs or businesses.'



Question Four (1 Mark)

1 mark for circling the correct response

hostility and ill-treatment, because of race or religious beliefs

Question Five (1 Mark)

1 mark for a relevant response which relates to them being discriminated and checked on easily

E.g. so they can be checked on and ensure they were following Hitler's orders.

Question Six (2 Marks)

1 mark for two pieces of evidence or two marks for three correct pieces of evidence.

E.g. They had a place hidden behind a bookshelf.

They had all worn their clothes in layers.

They walked barefoot.

They covered the windows with thick curtains.

Question Seven (1 Mark)

1 mark for a correct definition of 'cramped' in context

E.g. The place was uncomfortably small and restricted suggesting they could not relax comfortably in their 'home'.

Question Eight (1 Mark)

1 mark for a correct definition of 'solace'

E.g. to find comfort or consolation in a time of great distress or sadness.

Question Nine (2 Marks)

1 mark for two correct answers or two marks for all three correct answers

The Frank family always ensured their daughters were put first – true



Anne overlooked the negative aspects when writing in her diary – true
The Nazi's ended Anne's life tragically - false

Question Ten (3 Marks)

1 mark for a simple response with no elaboration

E.g. Anne would not have gained the recognition she deserved.

2 marks for two different points or one point with evidence

E.g. Anne would not have gained the recognition she deserved such as believing in all the positive outcomes as opposed to the negative ones. For example 'I don't think of all the misery but of beauty that still remains.'

3 marks are for two or more points both with a justification or evidence from the text

E.g. the Franks family and their struggles would not have been known about as it was Anne's diary that revealed some of the hardships and gave insight about who else they lived with behind the bookshelf. Also, people around the world might not have understood the struggles those of the Jewish faith struggled with because of Hitler. Anne would not have been able to inspire others with her quotes and positive outcomes such as 'where there's hope there's life' and Otto would not have been able to have known Anne's feelings about her time during the War.
