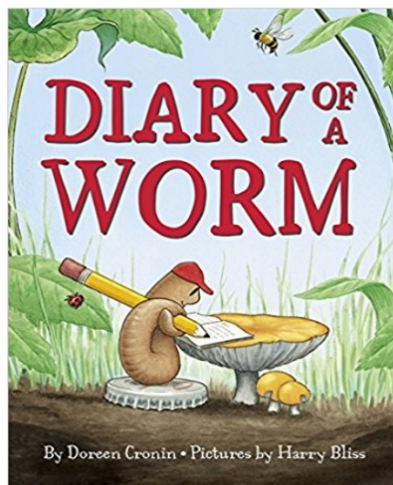

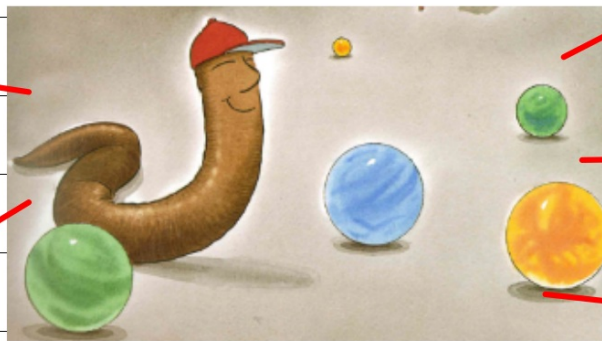

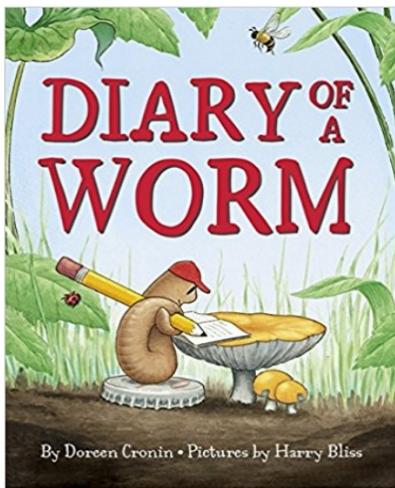
Look back through the story pages. Can you write down 4 good things about being a worm?
