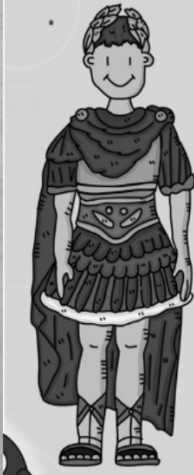

Julius Caesar – 54 BC



Caesar returned a year later for a second attempt, this time with 50,000 soldiers. **Initially they landed successfully** and began to march towards the River Thames. Some British tribes were defeated and others agreed to pay the Romans to leave them in peace.

At the same time, **the Romans were having other problems in Gaul (France) and the soldiers had to leave Britain** to go and help there.

This time, the Romans weren't taking any risks!
Julius has learned from his mistakes.
He brought 50,000 soldiers - too many for
Britain to try to oppose.

He marches inland for a couple of months. He
campaigns through the north of Kent, across the
Thames and fights the Catuvellauni tribe.

Claudius – AD 43



By AD 43, Emperor Claudius was in charge of the Roman Empire and he was **determined to conquer Britain**. He made sure that the soldiers were **well equipped with weapons**.

Many British tribes fought back, but the Romans were too strong. Over the next few years, there were many battles and the **Romans gained control** of most of Southern England. They went on to conquer Wales, Yorkshire and other parts of Britain.



Each tribe in Britain faced a choice – accept Roman rule peacefully (including paying them taxes), or fight back. What would you do in their position?
